BRIEF HISTORY

Unique Secondary School is the product of an answer to a call to give back to the society. It was established in 1998 as a day secondary school. By the 9th year, it changed its policy to become a boarding college accommodating students from within and outside Makurdi and indeed Benue State. Its main objective is to provide for students and staff, a broad and stimulating educational experience in a conducive learning environment to meet the growing societal challenges. To achieve this, the school has spacious dormitories and classes, well-equipped science laboratories, ICT centre, and well-maintained lawns and sporting facilities.

Unique Secondary School is a co-educational private school for young people between the ages of 11-18 years. Our natural multicultural campus is friendly and supportive with a peculiar stand of diversity where social networking abounds and friendships are forged.

Unique Secondary School currently admits students from various states in Nigeria. It is a comprehensive institution located in a serene and secure environment and it is approved by the Benue State Ministry of Education. With many staff resident on the compound, academic activities are a life pattern for the community.

Reformed and conceived as a contemporary school for science, arts, social science, entrepreneurship and ICT development, Unique Secondary School is a citadel of unique standards and academic excellence. Thus, bring your child to Unique Secondary School and in due time, we will give back to the society a responsible adult that will serve humanity.



BACKGROUND INFORMATION

1. The school boarding system

Unique Secondary School is strictly a boarding secondary school and all students reside in the hostel/dormitory within the school premises. Just like the home, Unique Secondary School hostel has facilities, wardrobes, toilets, laundry space, cloth lines, portable water from a solar powered borehole and constant power supply. Boys and girls reside in separate hostels housed by well-protected fence strictly for the occupants.

2. Sporting/House System

The school operates a four-house system and each student belongs to a house. That is, the Blue, Green, Red and White houses. Students are given sports wears and compound wears according to their houses apart from the general compound wear. Staff members are attached to these houses that are directly responsible for the students' welfare. Sporting competitions in the school are done according to the houses. This system encourages team work, healthy competition and provides a means of building links between students of varying ages. This is basically attained through sporting and social activities.

3. Student Hair/Laundry

Irrespective of gender, class or age, all students go on low cut. The school makes provision for a barber to visit the school appropriately.

In a bid to build the child who will become a responsible adult to serve his family and humanity, students in this school undertake washing of their clothes by themselves. This is done every Saturday and restricted to the hostel environment. Hence, laundry lines are provided in the hostel. Students are advised to strictly adhere to Saturday as the only laundry day.

4. Students Health

Unique Secondary School has a sick bay with a resident nurse to cater for both students and staff health needs. In addition, a proper arrangement with a qualified private hospital is in place to meet students' advanced medical needs. Parents are strongly advised to give details of medical history of their children to the school management to enable the school handle the students' medical issues well.

5. Visiting Days

The school is highly security conscious and visitors are not allowed into the school premises without proper clearance. The management allows only one visit in a term. This is usually on a Saturday of any month within the term which is communicated to the parents appropriately. Students are not allowed to see visitors except where this is duly arranged with the Principal. Notwithstanding, parents can call on the school to know the academic progress of the school. Visiting time on Visiting Days is between 8:00 a.m.to 5:00 p.m. No visitor will be allowed on the compound after 5:00 p.m.



Note the following:

- i. Students who persist in lingering or loitering with parents or visitor(s) after 6:00 p.m. shall risk going home for one (1) week suspension.
- ii. Any intrusion and quarrelling with the security person(s) at the gate or any interaction with the boarding house or any student therein without due authorization by the Principal shall attract one week suspension for the student concerned.
- iii. Students should be kind and polite to all visitors when welcoming them into the school. They are to direct him/her to the Principal's Office or the Matron/Patron. If a visitor intends to see a student on a non-visiting day, please direct them to the Principal.
- iv. Students who are expecting visitors on a visiting day should follow the normal time-table for the day until such visitors arrive.
- v. No visitors are allowed into the hostels under any circumstance. Students who violate this rule will be required to undergo manual labour.
- vi. Reception of parents/guardians on visiting day must be within the school compound. No other venue is allowed.

Note: 2 Names (father & mother) or those to visit the student should be submitted to the school with their passports for visitation permit.

6. Unique Secondary School Parent-Teacher Association

In a bid to carry the parents along in the general administration of the school, parents of Unique Secondary School students are automatically members of the P.T.A. Members of this association from time to time support the school in key areas of need. New parents are encouraged to key into this gesture. The Parent-Teacher Association meets at scheduled meetings which are duly communicated to the parents.

REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

In order to register, new students are expected to:

- i. Pay the prescribed school fees and tender the bank teller or receipt
- ii. Submit all the required documents.
- iii. Collect school uniforms.
- iv. Collect students' ID card.
- v. Get admission number from the V.P Administration.

The Required Documents

- i. First School Leaving Certificate (JSS 1 only) photocopy.
- ii. BECE statement of result (SSS1 only) photocopy.
- iii. Students' Previous Term's Result from the former school.
- iv. Transfer Certificate (new students in other classes apart from JSS1).



- v. A medical certificate of fitness from a government or missionary hospital.
- vi. Birth certificate (photocopy).
- vii. Three (3) passport sized photographs.

PERSONAL REQUIREMENTS/ITEMS LIST

Parents and guardians are required to meticulously scrutinize the personal dormitory items list so all the items are displayed and marked appropriately during check in. Note that students who do not have these complete will find it difficult to settle down and will **NOT** be allowed in to the hostel.

Pocket Money: Parents/Guardians are to deposit \$\frac{45}{2},000\$ with the Bursar for the emergency needs of their wards. The deposit is compulsory.



HOSTEL ETIQUETTES AND PROHIBITIONS

- i. The hostel and the dormitories are very respectable places for relaxation and rest. Silence should be strictly maintained.
- ii. Privacy of persons and their belongings should be strictly observed. Beds must be properly made with white bed sheets and pillow cases.
- iii. Students must keep their corners and belongings clean and tidy.
- iv. Early washing, singing, talking and playing are prohibited in the hostel.
- v. Any sick student must report on time to the matron or boarding master for quick medical attention.
- vi. Use of phone is **NOT** allowed for students either in the hostel or on the school compound. Students are not allowed to bring or use phones while in the school.
- vii. There must be no stealing or fighting in the hostel.

DINING RULES

- i. No student should come late to the dining hall.
- ii. Students should not stay in the dining hall beyond the stipulated time for dining which is 30minutes.
- iii. All students must sit at appropriate tables while meals are taken.
- iv. Fighting in the dining hall is prohibited.
- v. Noise making is equally prohibited.
- vi. On no account shall food be taken out of the dining hall.
- vii. The dining hall must be kept clean before and after meals are taken.
- viii. All pots, plates, spoons, cups and other cutlery must be washed before leaving the dining hall.
- ix. All food prefects must come into the dining hall 3minutes before other students and leave the dining hall 2minutes after every other student leaves.
- x. No dinner should be served in darkness. Lights must be switched on.
- xi. All table-leaders must ensure that tables are kept clean after meals.
- xii. No food collected should be thrown away by students.
- xiii. Food collected must be eaten.
- xiv. Writing on the walls of the dining hall is prohibited.
- xv. No student shall litter the dining hall or its surroundings.
- xvi. The dining hall must be locked after every meal.
- xvii. Tables and seats must always be well arranged.
- xviii. Sleeping in the dining hall is prohibited.
- xix. No writing materials (e.g. books) shall be taken into the dining hall.
- xx. Sharing of plates, cups, spoons and other cutlery is prohibited.
- xxi. All waste materials (refuse) must be disposed in the waste baskets.
- xxii. Waste baskets must be emptied when due.
- xxiii. Food must be served on equal basis except if a smaller portion is requested by a student.



- xxiv. No student shall collect food more than once at a time.
- xxv. No junior student shall collect food on behalf of a senior student.
- xxvi. Loss of cutlery must be reported to the food prefects (or food master) on time and be paid by the student.

xxvii. No student shall insult or quarrel with any cook.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- i. To keep to our vision, all students must participate in the curricular and extra-curricular activities of the school such as attendance of assemblies, classes, sports, etc.
- ii. The official languages of the school are English and French. It is therefore an offence to speak any other language within the school compound.
- iii. It is an offence to climb over the school fence into or out of the school.
- iv. A student must belong to at least two clubs or societies in the school e.g. debate, drama, press club etc.
- v. In case of an emergency, parent(s) wishing to see their wards on a day other than the open/visiting day must seek permission from the Principal.
- vi. It is an offence for students to disobey the constituted authority of the school i.e. staff and prefects.
 - Names of students' who contravene these rules shall be recorded in the students conduct book. Any student whose name occurs in the book three times shall be suspended.
